- Catalyzed 2,000 km regional walking trails
- Scouted 170 km in Kurdistan Region of Iraq
- \$3.3 M investment in Palestinian communitybased tourism
- \$50,000 investment in Sinai trail development
- 75 guides trained in mapping, wilderness first aid, and language skills


